



VIRGINIA

The River James is supposed to be the very middle River of Northern America and the only River that comes N^W from thence all over this Continent and makes fresh and as Indians report from the other side West of the River take their Original Spring out into the Sea especially fresh covered a very great River is called Black Mountains River out of which about the Salisburghs the Salisburghs River where formerly the Black Mountains came over and as far as Tidewater to the Chesapeake Bay and as the Indians report went over and destroyed the very great Nation and whether that same River comes out into the Bay of Mexico or the West Sea is not known. Certain it is that on the Westward is plentiful with great Stores of Minerals as the other side of these Mountains the same Minerals may be in process of time afford life to us here on this Side when occupied which is recommended to posterity to remember

The Land between James River and Roanoke River is for the most part Low Swamps Stoney Land not very fertile but with great plenty of Iron barres Silver Mines and other Downings Creemers

With the Tunnies out of the N^W West fork a difference they find the use of the River of Brack and so commeth towards the West that the very ground should be covered over with the same Brack

The Heads of these two Rivers proceed and the first out of the West fork and out out of hills or Mountains as other Rivers do.

The Stone derives from a Porphyry that was in the Valley where first was in the last Migration over Virginia. And carried amongst others in this Name by the Indians which was their watch N^W the Country there about being Champion and not much stony

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MARYLAND

The great Salisburghs River runs up Northward to the Mountains about 200 miles with Three Rivers and Branches on both sides to the East and West full of falls and the small about 10 or 15 miles above the Salisburghs falls and then it runs clear but Down wards are navigable but with great danger with Indians.
