HOSTILE FLEET OFF OUR COAST.

The enemy is near at hand ! Letters were received, by express, on Thursday evening last, from St. Mary's to the mayor of this city and the officer commanding the United States troops here, stating that a large British force was off St. Mary's bar, and that an attack was momentarily expected. Citizens ! be on the alert. *Watch*—for you know not when the enemy will make his appearance among you. A proclamation,* issued by admiral Cochrane, has also been received in town which tends to excite our black population. It is addressed to them, dated Bermuda, 2d April, 1814. An express left town on the evening of Thursday last to carry the above intelligence to the Governor.
